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"Good health and well-being for all" still represents an important challenge for policy makers around the world. Despite the available evidence and the proposed solutions, the response to this challenge by countries is still insufficient. The outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic has further exacerbated the problem of existing health inequalities by creating new ones, with long-term consequences that are still difficult to predict. However, this new health emergency also offers the opportunity to take the right actions to place people and their health at the centre of the recovery process of our country and the world.

How could achieving the Targets of SDG 3, on which Covid-19 has impacted so dramatically, could help us emerge from the current pandemic and be more prepared for possible future pandemics? The event, which will alternate testimonies and dialogues between experts, aims to answer this question through a reflection on the promotion of community health (first session), on the impact of the crisis on the vulnerable population (second session), on the need to strengthen the global health approach (third session).
